- Public Comment
  - Lauren Dever
    - Attended Planning Commission Hearing
      - Didn't feel concerns were heard or listened to
  - Sarah Wilde
    - Wondering what the pros are for the change
    - Tom Fuller
      - Tax revenue
      - 30 million generated in payroll
      - Potential increase in jobs
      - Continue support and discount to the town for materials
  - Barbara Martin
    - Wondering about new job creation
    - Air quality in the village
    - Doesn't understand what the benefit to the village is
    - Tom Fuller
      - Would not have to truck in additional aggregate
      - Regardless the asphalt, crushing plant operations would continue
  - Ingrid Halligan
    - has experienced 14 years of blasting and vibrations
    - Danby has very high taxes and doesn't feel it reflected in what is around her home
    - Constant disruption from truck traffic
  - Chris Hardaway
    - Questioning how the property could generate 30 million in payroll
  - Jenn Millard
    - Concerns about taxes
      - Will grieve hers
    - Concerns about house and property values dropping if the operation expands
  - Tricia Katz
    - Wasn't aware the operation was there when home was purchased

- Has looked at ariel views of the operation and doesn't like how is makes the town look
- Concerned about quality of life with having an operation like this so close to home and the village
- Concerned about homes on the market not selling, and loosing value

## Renata Aylward

- Loves how neighborly the town is, everyone helps each other out
- Kill the village kill the town
- Doesn't come across as a neighboring expansion

## Keith Millard

- Wondering where the seismographs are placed and who places them
  - Halligan, Porter, and Bender
  - Maine Drilling & Blasting does all of it
- Is it possible to get more than just a triangulation
  - Can more seismographs be place

#### Dana Tifft

- Has never come to complain to Fuller
- Is concerned about property values
- Concerned about damage to home and property from blasting

#### Sue Crosby

- Concerned about air quality
  - Already experiences issues with current operation
    - Smells and dust

#### Hinkle

- Wondering what happens to operation if change isn't approved
  - There is about 15 years left of material in current operation
  - Blasting would continue
  - In new spot operations would occur for 30 years and then be reclaimed
  - The expansion would allow for more efficient operation and extraction of material
  - Wouldn't have to truck in material for operations
  - If it doesn't expand the plants would continue operating regardless

#### Annette Smith

- Would like evidence to back up the numbers stated earlier about revenue regarding payroll, general revenue, and benefit to the town
- Concerned about it being within a potential ¼ mile buffer that could be part of the village designation
- Commented about the history and development of the town
  - Comes across that a business is being put ahead of the interest of the residents of the town.

# Tary Jesmonth

- Has lived on Easy Street since '86
- Spoke with Fuller about concerns a few years ago
- Offered to have a seismograph on his property
- Stated part of his ceiling fell in from a blast, but didn't mention it when it happened
- Concerned about additional access to the operation if it expands
- Who is responsible if damage occurs from a blast
  - Is Maine Drilling & Blasting insured and liable

#### Bob Millard

- Has a retaining wall that is 50 years old
  - Has never shifted until recently

- Blasting shakes his house
- Kim Corey
  - Confirming that Maine Drilling & Blasting sets the seismograph
    - Is a different company available to set them? The same company who
      is paid by Fuller who is doing the blasting isn't' also setting them
  - Hasn't shared issues in the past, was hoping it would just eventually end
  - Doesn't feel Fuller follows through when and issue is brought up
  - The industrial operation in town is a nuisance to the people
    - Doesn't want it to expand
- Kieth Millard
  - Asked if Fuller ever went and talked to neighbors after blasting to hear their experience
    - Should communicated and reach out instead of having issues brought forth
  - Wondering about subcontractors for seismograph placements
- Tricia Katz
  - Was very impressed with the sense of community when she moved here
  - Asking that the community is listened to when expressing their concerns
- Ingrid Halligan
  - It is difficult to prove damage from blasting
  - Must present to insurance with direct evidence
  - It is costly to pursue
- Dana Tifft
  - Willing to have a seismograph placed in his yard
  - Asked how spots were selected
- Annette Smith
  - Has experience with issues that come from blasting
  - Nearly impossible to prove damage from blasting
  - Was involved with the previous Act 250 for Fuller
    - Was willing to work with experts to test air quality
  - There are ways to make quarries good neighbors
  - Community based involvement can help with working with experts to identify things that can be improved to lessen the impacts of an operation
- Micheal Lees
  - There is a lack of information to make an informed decision on the change
- Basil Corey
  - Concerned about the smells from the plant, smells terrible
- Cindy Crandall
  - Concerned about smells, especially of propone
  - Concerned with the recent blasting
- Vedanta Griffith
  - Concerned about Community Safety
    - Recalls when that was brought up when Cannabis Dispensaries were first mentioned
    - Wondering why community safety is not being mentioned now
  - Mentioned no zoning in Danby
  - Why is the town plan being outdated being brought up now
  - Concerns about the effect on village designation
  - Wondering who is responsible for damages that occur from the operation
- Tracy Porter
  - Agrees with all the statements that have been made
  - First noticed a crack in living room in 2010
    - Communicated with Fuller about it and what can be done

- Was offered money for repairs and told it wouldn't happen again
- Has had other damages to house from blasting
- Keeps records when blasting occurs and inspects for other damages
  - Has pictures and videos from blastng
- Hearing ended at 7:30pm
